Why does Wolverhampton IASS exist?

An Information, Advice and Support Service is a statutory service which means:

"A local authority in England must arrange for children and young people for whom it is responsible, and the parents of children for whom it is responsible, to be provided with advice and information about matters relating to the special educational needs of the children or young people concerned."

- Children and Families Act 2014

Wolverhampton Information, Advice and Support Service (WIASS) provides information, advice and support to children and young people (0-25) with SEND and their parents and carers which is:

- Free to access
- Confidential
- Impartial

WIASS is a **small** team with **4** dedicated hardworking members of staff.

We aim to respond to referrals within 3 working days.

- Anyone can refer in to the service. There is no eligibility criteria.
- ✓ Your child or young person does not need to have a diagnosis or EHCP to receive advice from WIASS.

Available support

WIASS offers information, advice and support about:

- Education, health and social care matters and relevant law
- Support available in schools, early years and post 16 settings
- > Funding arrangements
- > How needs are identified and met
- Disagreements and moving forward

WIASS provides:

- ✓ SEND legal training for parents, carers, young people and professionals in person workshops and online
- a website with lots of information and resources for SEND
- a casework service where advice and support is tailored to meet an individual's needs and situation

Personal Budgets and Personal Health Budgets

What is a Personal Budget?

A Personal Budget (PB) for special educational needs (SEN) is an amount of money identified to pay for support specified in section F (Special Educational Provision) of an Education, Health and Care plan (EHCP) for a child or young person with special educational needs. It is usually funded by the local authority's education service.

A Personal Budget can also be used for identified social care needs and will be provided by the local authority's social care service. These needs would be identified through a social care assessment.





Who can have a Personal Budget?

Parents of a child with an EHCP, or a young person with an EHCP, can request a Personal Budget during the Education, Health and Care needs assessment process. Inform the SEND Officer, who is responsible for drafting the EHCP that you would like a personal budget for some / all of the special educational provision.
