As a school, we are so lucky to have such dedicated, caring and thoughtful staff members.

End of Term News

I am sure you will all be aware of the news about the changes to the school's leadership following my appointment to the role of Executive Headteacher.

To confirm, I will remain as Headteacher at Oak Meadow working one day a week. For the remaining other days, I will be at Woodfield Primary School in Penn. In my absence, Mr Lane will lead the school as Interim Head of School with Miss Billingsley as Interim Assistant Headteacher. Both Mr Lane and Miss Billingsley will continue to be supported by Miss Tomlinson and Miss Bates - who will return from maternity in December. This is an exciting opportunity for all staff and I know the school will continue to be led perfectly with Mr Lane's visionary, strategic approach. It was a very difficult decision for me to make as I have been at Oak Meadow for 14 years and I continue to thoroughly enjoy my job and role, working with such amazing children and staff - alongside you and your most encouraging support. However, I look forward to working at Woodfield whilst knowing I am maintaining my links and responsibilities with Oak Meadow.

INSET Days: A reminder that school will close for the summer holidays today (Friday 21st July) and will reopen for all children on Wednesday 6th September. The 4th and 5th will be taken as INSET Days to facilitate time for safeguarding and all health and safety training which staff are required to do annually.

School Attainment Outcomes

One measure of school effectiveness and the impact upon children's knowledge acquisition and skill development is statutory attainment data. This provides a measure of teaching and learning effectiveness within the core areas of reading, writing and mathematics. I am thrilled to share with you that at all stages, we have exceeded national averages and again, I dedicate this to our outstanding teaching team and to your children who rise to the daily challenge of learning.

A summary of outcomes is as follows:

Meal Price Increase

We have been notified by our catering contractor that due to increased food prices – rising by 13.1% - our individual school meal price is rising to £2.50 (a slightly lower price increase of 8.7%). It is always with disappointment that I write with such information but I hope you will understand the requirement for raising the cost given the increased food prices and staffing costs we hear about in the news – affecting all of us in our daily lives. We will continue to operate a flexible approach to ordering a meal for your child/ren depending on your home circumstances. The menu will be emailed to you towards the start of the new school year in time to support your sharing of it with your child/ren.

Gold Tokens and Reading Books: I write appealingly to ask for your support. We are seeing a shrinking reduction in our gold tokens and I wonder if instead of posting them into the school's celebratory tubes, children have brought them home. I am sure children do this with excitement and eagerness for sharing their reward with you. If so, can they be sent back into school, please? Thank you. Also, can I please ask if you mind checking if you have any school reading scheme/ library books at home? This will support our budget costs or replacement of lost books in the future. THANK YOU.

Attendance and Punctuality: As previously referenced in a former newsletter, I am extremely appreciative for the punctual arrival of children to school between 8.35 and 8.45a.m. As you will be aware from the attendance certificate included within your child's summer term report, the Government has set an expectation for an annual attendance of 96%. Attendance below this is of concern and attendance of 90% or below is classified as persistent absence. All persistent absent children will be more closely monitored in the new school year to ensure children are accessing school in line with statutory and legal duties. Mr Lane will be sending further information about boosting attendances of children in the new school year. I do thank you for your support and adherence to both school and government's policies.
