English

In our writing sessions, we will begin the term by focussing on developing the specific grammar and punctuation skills that our children will need to be able to use effectively in their writing during year 3, using the animation *Planet Unknown* in order to support this. We will then move on to writing narrative recounts of *The Wild Robot*, along with reports based around our geography learning on the Amazon rainforest, as well as producing our own poetry.

Our reading lessons will continue to give our children the chance to read and enjoy a diverse range of high-quality texts, developing their reading skills and using these to answer 'big questions' around the text, beginning with the brilliant *Journey* trilogy of picture books by Aaron Becker.

We will continue to learn and practise spellings weekly, testing ourselves on these every Friday.

PSHE

This term we will be focusing on the following areas and themes:

- Keeping and staying safe—leaning out of windows
- Keeping and staying healthy—medicine
- Relationships—touch

Music – we will be working with Mr Crane to develop our understanding of the dimensions of music, based around the song 'Let Your Spirit Fly'. In the second part of the term, we will go on to explore playing and performing using the glockenspiel.

Art - our children will explore drawing and collage through the work of Salvador Dali and Frida Kahlo, drawing on elements of surrealism in order to create their own collage self-portraits

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{D8T}}$ – we will be developing the skills of decorating and joining fabric, in order to create a bookmark for a specific consumer.

Mathematics
