<u>English:</u>

During the Spring term, children will be focusing on the wellknown Roald Dahl novel, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. Whilst studying the text, they will have the opportunity to write emotive letters from the perspective of Charlie Bucket, create a setting description of the famous Chocolate Room and produce a set of instructions for their own confectionary creation. Children will also explore the features of a non-chronological report and use these when writing an information leaflet on how chocolate is produced.

Spelling, punctuation and grammar, will remain a focus during the Spring term and children will be given the opportunity to complete weekly mini-assessments to track their progress.


