# FRANCE Dinosaur skeleton set to sell for $\pm 1$ m

A dinosaur skeleton is set to sell for £1million at auction. Dinosaur remains rarely come up for sale, but this one will be sold on 20th October in France. The Camptosaurus skeleton was discovered in Wyoming, USA, around 30 years ago and is called Barry, after the palaeontologist that restored it. 
lot harder than it looked and required years of training. He is part of a team of people who attempted the jump, but Jan was the only one to make the unicorn landing successfully.
