Dear Parents/ Carers.

Welcome back to the new half-term. I hope that everyone enjoyed a relaxing holiday last week as we look forward to the upcoming weeks - with so many notable calendar dates ahead of us - I am writing this letter to make you aware of the key events as we approach the festive season.

Working together with our amazing Friends of Oak Meadow and super school council, we aim to make Christmas a memorable experience for every child, full of fun and excitement. We would like to replicate the huge success of last year's Christmas Fair (Friday 15th December) with a difference as, with your support and donations, we aim to host a community event where pre-loved children's toys, games and clothes will be on sale. These items can be purchased for a nominal price for you to send on to Santa in order to be wrapped and delivered for the big day!

In addition to these dates, this Friday (10th November) we will celebrate Diwali Day at Oak Meadow completing wide ranging activities across the school including learning about the story of Diwali, completing Rangoli artwork, singing and dancing. Weather permitting(!) there is also a plan to produce Rangoli patterns on the Key Stage 1 playground after school where families are invited to contribute alongside children.
