Dear Parents and Carers.

I start by writing this letter amazed at the speed in which this half term has passed by and with surprise realising that we are now half way through the school year – in fact, more than half way if counting the actual number of weeks. It has been a busy half term in school and a hard working one for our children but as always, I am pleased with their responsiveness and the hard work they have applied to their learning. They are outstanding...we are very immensely proud of them.

COVID-19 Control Measures

Following a previous letter, I now confirm that following the half term holiday, we will resume a normal school day for all children on Monday 28th February. Therefore, the times will be as follows:

8.45 - 8.55a.m. arrival at school

By 8.55a.m, all children must be seated within their classroom in readiness for the calling of the register. This is a government statutory duty and it is therefore imperative children are within class by this time in order to avoid being marked absent. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

3.15p.m. end of the school day

All children will be dismissed at this time. Again, as previously written, I wish to thank you for your support this half term with the different dismissal times, particularly when siblings have been in different year groups. This has helped to minimise possible transmission. Thank you.

Regarding the national picture, it is encouraging to hear of the falling number of cases and it is with this information that we have reviewed the school day times. Other safety controls will remain in place at the moment and will be reviewed as the rest of the school year progresses...such as children's distinct morning and lunchtime play areas and designated seating within the dining room. Following the half term holiday, we will also resume our rota for children accessing the school hall for celebration assemblies and hymn practices – whilst other classes continue to access them virtually. A cautionary approach is still being advised alongside the continual promotion of the vaccination programme. Several times during the last two years of the pandemic, I have shared with you my hope for a full and normal resuming of school routines such as curriculum workshops, open mornings, Reception Come and Play sessions and I am becoming more optimistic for these events to be planned as the year progresses.

Parent Consultations

As an advance notice, this term's parent and carer consultations will take place face to face and this will provide you with an opportunity to view your children's books and to see the wonderful progress your child/ren is/are making. Information will follow after half term for the booking of the appointments but for your diary, the dates are: Tuesday 29th March 3.30-7.00p.m. and Wednesday 30th March 3.30-5.30p.m. We will also share with you your child's attainment and progress to-date at the end of the term in the





normal termly report sheet before receiving the more detailed and comprehensive end of year report at the end of the summer term.

Comic Relief




WOW!
