School Uniform

A reminder of our school expectations.... summer uniform can be worn until Friday 25th October. Following the half term holiday, winter uniform must be worn. In preparation for both September and the wearing of winter uniform, can I respectfully ask that all items are named. Thank you.

Parent Workshops

This year we have organised many parent/carer workshops and have endeavoured wherever possible to offer them both in a morning, afternoon or twilight session. However, given your commitments, attendance has been low so therefore, next year you will receive invitations to work alongside your child/ren within their class where current pedagogy can be directly shared. We are also aware of giving you enough notice of these events and so you will receive a list of school events for the whole year in September.

Funsters/ Breakfast Club

May we ask all parents to ensure that all accounts are brought up to date with all balances being clear by 27th July. The cost for Breakfast Club will increase to £2.20 per day from September.



School Dinners for Key Stage 2 pupils.

School meals cost £2.20 per day, £11.00 per week. As stipulated by our catering providers, school dinners must be paid for in advance of the week. It is possible to opt for school meals on certain days of the week but we would ask you to let us know on Mondays which days your child is staying and make payments accordingly. Payment should be made via ParentPay only.

Please note that holidays during term time are discouraged and will incur a fine unless circumstances are deemed "exceptional" by the Headteacher and Governors.

Start of the Autumn Term

Governors have recently approved our planning of INSET Days in September and this year, Monday 2nd and Tuesday 3rd September will be INSET Days. Therefore, school will commence for all children on Wednesday 4th September. Children must be in class by 8:55 am as the statutory register is called. Please support this by ensuring your children arrive punctually and are ready to start the day at 8:55 am in the classroom. Thank you.

We are also changing the doors by which some children exit at the end of the day. Therefore, starting on Wednesday 4th September, Year 5 will exit via the door between Year 1 and 2 classrooms and Year 6 will exit via the door next to the main entrance door. This will eliminate congestion and provide a safer handing over of children to you. For Year 6 children who walk home on their own, a letter of authorisation must be signed and returned to school in September.

Summer Squad Programme

Working together, city partners have planned over 200 events and activities for children and young people to enjoy the city this summer.
